


Satchel One: Supporting a Phased Return to School

With the government announcing a phased return to school this could mean that many teachers will be having to cater for in-class learning as well as remote teaching. Or, one teacher may be tasked with supervising a class for the entire school day.


By continuing to set work via Show My Homework for all classes, regardless of whether they're in school or at home, all students will receive the work that's intended for them. Students will be able to continue asking for support online or in class - depending on their learning environment.

Additionally, the continuation of this method of content delivery will provide much needed consistency to all stakeholders and help ease the transition back into school.

Seating

Ensuring the safety of students upon their return to school, as well as staff, will be of the utmost importance to schools. In order to ensure social distancing rules remain, carefully constructed seating arrangements will need to be made.

With Seating, teachers can design classrooms in line with government guidelines, populating desks and ensuring enough space is left between each student for them to learn safely.



Timetables
